

Camden Township Regular Meeting

April 11th, 2024

The Town Board of the Town of Camden, Carver County, Minnesota met at the Camden Town Hall, April 11th, 2024, at 7:30pm. Members present were Deputy Clerk Roger Sauerbrey, Treasurer Denise Zellmann, Supervisors Gerry Goede, David Zellmann, & Bill Devine. Steve Burns from Burns Excavating present. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Bill Devine.

Greg Guse & Lorie Brinkman were present for a brief discussion on road pickup. Goede informed them that the dumpster was in place and the safety vests were also on hand.

A motion made by Zellmann, seconded by Goede to approve the March 14th regular meeting minutes. Motion carried. A motion made by Zellmann, seconded by Devine to approve the payroll, and claims for payment of \$7,606.57. See attached list. Goede abstained due to a conflict of interest, being paid for maintenance work. Motion carried. A motion made by Zellmann, seconded by Devine to approve the Treasurer’s report, stating the Clerk and Treasurer’s books balance with the bank statement. Motion carried.

Clerk’s Report: There was a Carver County Board of Adjustment public hearing on April 3rd to consider the application of Chad Braun for a variance to build an attached garage. The board did not attend.

Supervisors Report: Devine & Goede attended a short course which they said was very good. Goede reported that it is very important that the Township insures its equipment and buildings for replacement costs.

Discussion Included:

1. Devine and his wife attended Township Day at the Capitol. They spend time letting legislators know the importance of funding roads and bridges. It was a good day.
2. June Meeting date. Devine cannot make that date and requested a change to Wednesday June 12th. All agreed.
3. Gary Grimm had a question regarding zoning laws in reference to Zebra Ave. Referring to John Fahey.
4. Donnie Heuer has been asked about furnishing gravel for the 212-gravel project. No decisions yet.
5. Goede was asked who is responsible for taking care of the ditch through the Mechtel farm? Suerbrey stated that he volunteered for over 50 years to organize any maintenance for the ditch from the Crow River to the Paul Rogers land south of County Road 32. The only money spent, which landowners were asked to donate, was for contractors doing the clean-out. No money was ever charged for the administrative work. It is a private ditch which contains public waters. Each landowner is responsible for the ditch on their land.

Road & Equipment Report: Shouldering is done. Will be starting dust control the week of May 13th. Steve Burns is in charge of grading and will take complaint calls. No plans for adding gravel to any roads yet.

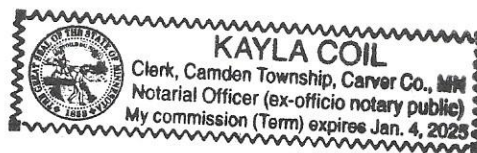
Accident and injury report was filled out.
